MESSAGE FROM REV ANDY

I wonder what scares you? Unless you are Daredevil, the Marvel hero famously called 'The man without fear' we all have something that we are afraid of, and sometimes even things we develop a phobia about. Change can be something that worries many of us, especially changes that we can't control, and we have seen plenty of that during the course of the pandemic. In our gospel reading for today we see Jesus disciples panicking and terrified as their boat is swamped by a vicious and unexpected storm.

One of the greatest temptations in life is the desire to be in control – to have everything sorted, to know where we are going, to have all the different aspects of our lives in its own box, and the danger is we have one of those boxes for our faith. We define its limits – we live our lives charting our own course, making our own decisions, but if someday we should find ourselves caught up in one of the storms of life, well then we have God to fall back on.

The problem is that's not how it works. Being a Christian means handing over the reigns to God – giving up the controls to him. Of course we are responsible for the way we live day to day, but ultimate control--final authority in our lives--rests with God, as we know Him through Jesus. The desperate disciples caught up in that storm turn to Jesus who is seemingly untroubled and asleep in the back of the boat. Don't you care they scream at him over the roaring wind, we are all about to die.

And maybe there have been times when we have echoed those words to God in our pain and fear – don't you care? Don't you care my life is in ruins, don't you care about all I am suffering? Don't you care about my loss, about the trouble I'm in?

And of course Jesus does care, his deep, never ending compassion led him to suffer and die on the cross for all of us. He knows what we face, what we are going through, and he is right there in the boat with us.

Jesus is moving those men in the boat from being fishermen to disciples. And he is preparing them to work for a future so very different from the one they'd either expected or wanted. He works that way with us as well.

When we encounter the living God our lives will never be the same again. And that can be a scary thought, but it is also exciting and challenging, because he will change our lives in ways we never thought possible – lead us to places we would never have reached without him.

FIRST READING : Psalm 9:9-20

The LORD is a stronghold for the oppressed,
a stronghold in times of trouble.

for you, O LORD, have not forsaken those who seek you.

SECOND READING : Mark 4: 35-41

³⁵ On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side.' ³⁶ And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. ³⁷ A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. ³⁸ But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' ³⁹ He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. ⁴⁰ He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' ⁴¹ And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'
