MESSAGE FROM REV ANDY

Sadly the lockdown restrictions have not ended when they were originally planned to, and we have to continue for the time being not being able to sing together, having to wear masks in church, and not sharing in the common cup at communion. However, we are attempting to find some creative ways to work within the guidelines such as the introduction of the individual glasses, the incorporation of new worship resources and the use of action songs in all age worship, which I hope have been well received.

The national church is in a time of transformation, and I think we all accept that we won't simply go back to the pre-covid 'business as usual'. There must, and will be things we need to reclaim as part of our worship and mission, but there will also be new practices we want to continue, and a realistic view of things that have now had their time. All this local thinking will form part of our vision day now scheduled for the 18th September.

I was reminded of an experience at Ufton church earlier this year, where dozens of butterflies that overwinter in the church emerge from their chrysalis in the spring, creating beautiful patterns of colour in the church windows, and have to be rounded up and released outside by wardens Andy and Adelle.

In a sense the church is also in that chrysalis stage, waiting for the moment to emerge into the light, to take its new form, and to be set free into the world to fly high and have a new perspective on the communities around us. The patterns and colours of butterflies draw the attention of those who encounter them, they bring joy and an appreciation of their beauty. Can we share something of that same nature, finding new ways to reflect the love and invitation that God extends to everyone.

Let's be patient in this season of transformation and be open to how God wants to change his church and each of us who are part of his body on Earth.

TODAY'S BIBLE READINGS

FIRST READING : Psalm 130

Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord.

2 Lord, hear my voice!

Let your ears be attentive
to the voice of my supplications!

3 If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities,
Lord, who could stand?

4 But there is forgiveness with you,
so that you may be revered.

5 I wait for the Lord, my soul waits,
and in his word I hope;

6 my soul waits for the Lord
more than those who watch for the morning,
more than those who watch for the morning.

7 O Israel, hope in the Lord!

For with the Lord there is steadfast love,
and with him is great power to redeem.

8 It is he who will redeem Israel
from all its iniquities.

SECOND READING : Mark 5:21-43

21 When Jesus had crossed again in the boat[a] to the other side, a great crowd gathered round him; and he was by the lake. 22 Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet 23 and begged him repeatedly, 'My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live.' 24 So he went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. 25 Now there was a woman who had been suffering from haemorrhages for twelve years. 26 She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. 27 She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, 28 for she said, 'If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well.' 29 Immediately her haemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. 30 Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, 'Who touched my clothes?' 31 And his disciples said to him, 'You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, "Who touched me?"' 32 He looked all round to see who had done it. 33 But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. 34 He said to her, 'Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease.'

35 While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader's house to say, 'Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?' 36 But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, 'Do not fear, only believe.' 37 He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. 38 When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. 39 When he had entered, he said to them, 'Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping.' 40 And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. 41 He took her by the hand and said to her, 'Talitha cum', which means, 'Little girl, get up!' 42 And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. 43 He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.
