A MESSAGE FROM REV ANDY

The month of November has traditionally been a time of remembering. Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day are important times to stop and remember the sacrifice made by others for our freedom. At the beginning of November in the church calendar we remembered the Saints on All Saints Day and following on from that we remembered loved ones we have lost at the Night of our Light event at Harbury church. The timing of Armistice Day, and hence Remembrance Sunday, relates to the signing of the Armistice agreement at the end of World War 1, but seems to fit well with the churches existing season of remembering. And this year, as sometimes happens on the last Sunday in November, we also celebrate Advent Sunday, remembering the events leading up to the coming of Jesus and joining in that sense of expectant waiting as we prepare once again for Christmas. Perhaps November is a good month in which to remember and take stock. We remember all that we have gone through during the time of COVID, the way we have all been impacted, and how much has changed over that time, for good or bad. In our society remembering is important too. In schools and universities every day young people are taught and then must remember some of that wisdom in exams (which I always hated and was hopeless at!) One of the pillars of our faith is the wisdom we have inherited from past generations. So perhaps this November we again have the opportunity to remember, to recognise what blessings the past has brought as well as what we have lost, and to identify what is important to hold on to, as well as what to let go of, as we move into the future and look to God for our hope and our direction.

A PRAYER

God of Eternity, we give thanks for the past, and those who made us who we are and who made our community and our nation what it is today. We also give thanks for the present and the future. We look to you for hope. The present is unsettling, the future is uncertain. Show us the opportunities around us in our chaotic world. Remind us of our priorities as people of faith, help us to see how our choices matter, and then fill us with hope for a renewed world. God of our future, may we walk boldly into what may come, as a people of faith and hope.

SECOND READING : Mark 13:1-8

3 When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, 4 'Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?' 5 Then Jesus began to say to them, 'Beware that no one leads you astray. 6 Many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and they will lead many astray. 7 When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come. 8 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. LADBROKE CHURCH COVID PROCEDURES— UPDATE

Over the past weeks we have been asking people to continue to sit in alternate pews and to wear masks at the back. It has been suggested that we now relax these procedures. Please note that anyone who still wishes to wear a mask, and/or to keep their distance from other members of the congregation should be and feel able to do so. We also intend to continue using individual cups for Communion for the time being.

Before making these changes we want to give an opportunity for any feedback, so please continue with current practice this week. If you would like to express your views, particularly if you have any concerns, please do so either by reply email or by having a word with Andy or either of the wardens.

HARBURY CHURCH COVID GUIDANCE —UPDATE

The PCC agreed the following:

Masks are now optional in church - those who wish to continue wearing a mask should sit on the right hand side of the church, those who do not, on the left.

Congregational singing will now resume, at the moment we will use recorded music, but may well bring in an organist at same stage.

Communion will continue as at present with individual cups, and masked and unmasked people will not mix together as they come up to receive the elements.

After service refreshments will resume once a rota has been finalised.
