## FROM REVD ANDY:

As I was reflecting on our gospel reading for this week, I was struck by the words of one commentator, who noted that as we read Jesus list of blessings and woes, perhaps we need to ask ourselves 'Do we need a pat on the back, or a kick up the rear? Another suggested we could also ask ourselves these questions - where are we in our lives? What are we becoming? And who gets to decide who we are becoming? There are many influences in our lives pushing us to fit a particular mould, to be swept along with the crowd, to prioritise money or success or pleasure, and not to make too many waves along the way. But Jesus challenges us to make different choices, to take the road less travelled, even though sometimes that may lead us to turn away from where others may expect us to go. Jesus is aiming his words today at his disciples rather than the wider audience, those men who had sacrificed much to follow him; and maybe his challenge to us today as his followers is to ask one final question of ourselves, which is simply 'what about everyone else?'

### Prayer

***Lord, give us each day the wisdom to recognise which things are important, and which things are not. Show us how best to use the time and talents you have given us. Help us to use all opportunities wisely that we may give in service to others the good gifts we have received from you. Amen.***

## BIBLE READINGS

### Jeremiah 17:5-10

5 Thus says the Lord:  
Cursed are those who trust in mere  
mortals  
and make mere flesh their strength,  
whose hearts turn away from the Lord.  
6 They shall be like a shrub in the desert,  
and shall not see when relief comes.  
They shall live in the parched places of the  
wilderness,  
in an uninhabited salt land.  
7 Blessed are those who trust in the Lord,  
whose trust is the Lord.  
8 They shall be like a tree planted by water,  
sending out its roots by the stream.  
It shall not fear when heat comes,  
and its leaves shall stay green;  
in the year of drought it is not anxious,  
and it does not cease to bear fruit.  
9 The heart is devious above all else;  
it is perverse—  
who can understand it?  
10 I the Lord test the mind  
and search the heart,  
to give to all according to their ways,  
according to the fruit of their doings.

### Luke 6:17-26

#### Jesus Teaches and Heals

17 He came down with them and stood on a  
level place, with a great crowd of his  
disciples and a great multitude of people

from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of  
Tyre and Sidon. 18 They had come to hear  
him and to be healed of their diseases; and  
those who were troubled with unclean  
spirits were cured. 19 And all in the crowd  
were trying to touch him, for power came  
out from him and healed all of them.

20 Then he looked up at his disciples and  
said:

'Blessed are you who are poor,  
for yours is the kingdom of God.

21 'Blessed are you who are hungry now,  
for you will be filled.

'Blessed are you who weep now,  
for you will laugh.

22 'Blessed are you when people hate you,  
and when they exclude you, revile you, and  
defame you on account of the Son of  
Man. 23 Rejoice on that day and leap for joy,  
for surely your reward is great in heaven; for  
that is what their ancestors did to the  
prophets.

24 'But woe to you who are rich,  
for you have received your consolation.

25 'Woe to you who are full now,  
for you will be hungry.

'Woe to you who are laughing now,  
for you will mourn and weep.

26 'Woe to you when all speak well of you,  
for that is what their ancestors did to the  
false prophets.
