REFLECTIONS FROM THE RECTORY

I recently discovered a YouTube channel called 'Inside Russia' which I commend to you for an inside view of what ordinary Russian people are thinking and experiencing during the conflict with Ukraine. Constantine, the host, gives a very honest appraisal of the situation, within the constraints of his situation, and it is clear how worried and depressed many Russian people are and how little support the political leaders have for this tragic situation. From time to time Constantine also asks his viewers to share in a short time of prayer at the end of his broadcasts and is at pains to stress how the difficulties in Russia are in no way comparable to the suffering in Ukraine. His experience is that the oppression of the old Soviet Union is beginning to return, and the relative freedoms that came about at the beginning of the century are now under serious threat. He himself has travelled to many western countries and this has given him an appreciation of how much we all have in common, and how, if we all had that experience there would be so much less conflict in the world. As we focus on the election of a new Prime Minister we are probably all too well aware of the frailties of our political systems and leaders, but ultimately what matters is that awareness of all we have in common, wherever we live, the value every life has to God, and the need for our world to be renewed and remade as the Kingdom of God grows.

Prayer

Heavenly Father we grieve for so much unnecessary death and suffering in Ukraine, and we pray for peace to come. We pray for the people of both Ukraine and Russia who have so much in common, and like all of us, are precious in your eyes. We pray that the madness that drives this conflict would be overcome and brought to an end, and that we may not see a return to the divisiveness of the cold war. Open our eyes to the common humanity we all share and may love overcome hate.

BIBLE READINGS

Hosea 1.2-10

The Family of Hosea

2 When the Lord first spoke through Hosea, the Lord said to Hosea, 'Go, take for yourself a wife of whoredom and have children of whoredom, for the land commits great whoredom by forsaking the Lord.' 3 So he went and took Gomer daughter of Diblaim, and she conceived and bore him a son.

4 And the Lord said to him, 'Name him Jezreel; for in a little while I will punish the house of Jehu for the blood of Jezreel, and I will put an end to the kingdom of the house of Israel. 5 On that day I will break the bow of Israel in the valley of Jezreel.'

6 She conceived again and bore a daughter. Then the Lord said to him, 'Name her Lo-ruhamah, for I will no longer have pity on the house of Israel or forgive them. 7 But I will have pity on the house of Judah, and I will save them by the Lord their God; I will not save them by bow, or by sword, or by war, or by horses, or by horsemen.'

8 When she had weaned Lo-ruhamah, she conceived and bore a son. 9 Then

the Lord said, 'Name him Lo-ammi, for you are not my people and I am not your God.'

The Restoration of Israel

10 Yet the number of the people of Israel shall be like the sand of the sea, which can be neither measured nor numbered; and in the place where it was said to them, 'You are not my people', it shall be said to them, 'Children of the living God.'

Luke 11.1-13

The Lord's Prayer

11 He was praying in a certain place, and after he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, 'Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples.' 2 He said to them, 'When you pray, say:

Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread.

4 And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial.'

Perseverance in Prayer

5 And he said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend, and you go to him at midnight and say to him, "Friend, lend me three loaves of bread; 6 for a friend of mine has arrived, and I have nothing to set before him." 7 And he answers from within, "Do not bother me; the door has already been locked, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot get up and give you anything." 8 I tell you, even though he will not get up and give him anything because he is his friend, at least because of his persistence he will get up and give him whatever he needs.

9 'So I say to you, Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you. 10 For everyone who asks receives, and everyone who searches finds, and for everyone who knocks, the door will be opened. 11 Is there anyone among you who, if your child asks for a fish, will give a snake instead of a fish? 12 Or if the child asks for an egg, will give a scorpion? 13 If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'
