## REFLECTIONS FROM THE RECTORY

*The parable of the lost sheep and the lost coin, the lectionary reading for this week, speaks about an experience we will all be able to relate to. Losing and finding something or someone. I expect we have all lost things, some inconsequential, but maybe also some things that are irreplaceable. I was very sad to lose a ring that Julie had bought me while we were on holiday in Greece a few years ago, it wasn't the monetary value of the ring so much as the emotional significance it represented. I replaced it with one I bought when we returned to Greece, but that attachment was lost. Sometimes of course when we lose something, even if it isn't worth very much, we still invest huge amounts of time and energy into trying to find it. People can end up lost too – not sure why they have ended up where they are, not sure which way to go, what voice to listen to. Jesus describes his mission as 'to seek and to save that which was lost'. So many people are lost and vulnerable, and in need of rescue. Its so easy to lose sight of the important things in life. To God there is nothing better than just one person finding new life and purpose in him. So we too should experience that joy when we see someone brought into that new relationship with God, when we see their life being transformed by the Holy Spirit, and we should spare no effort to play our part in making that happen.*

## BIBLE READINGS

### Ephesians 4: 11-16

Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

### Luke 24:13-31

That same day two of Jesus' disciples were going to the village of Emmaus, which was about eleven kilometres from Jerusalem. As they were talking and thinking about what had happened, Jesus came near and started walking along beside them. But they did not know who he was. Jesus asked them, "What were you talking about as you walked along?" The two of them stood there looking sad and gloomy. Then the one named Cleopas asked Jesus, "Are you the only person from Jerusalem who didn't know what was happening there these last few days?"

"What do you mean?" Jesus asked. They answered: Those things that happened to Jesus from Nazareth. By what he did and said he showed that he was a powerful prophet, who pleased God and all the people. Then the chief priests and our leaders had him arrested and sentenced to die on a cross. We had hoped that he would be the one to set Israel free! But it has already been three days since all this happened. Some women in our group surprised us. They had gone to the tomb early in the morning, but did not find the body of Jesus. They came back, saying they had seen a vision of angels who told them that he is alive. Some men from our group went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said. But they didn't see Jesus either. Then Jesus asked the two disciples, "Why can't you understand? How can you be so slow to believe all that the prophets said? Didn't you know that the Messiah would have to suffer before he was given his glory?" Jesus then explained everything written about himself in the Scriptures, beginning with the Law of Moses and the Books of the Prophets. When the two of them came near the village where they were going, Jesus seemed to be going farther. They begged him, "Stay with us! It's already late, and the sun is going down." So Jesus went into the house to stay with them. After Jesus sat down to eat, he took some bread. He blessed it and broke it. Then he gave it to them. At once they knew who he was, but he disappeared.
