## REFLECTIONS FROM THE RECTORY

*We can so easily lose sight of the importance and effectiveness of prayer. We know that its something we should be doing more, and we often realise that its important to help us maintain our relationship with God, but all too often it can take a back seat in our busy lives or just become something routine and taken for granted. Well this week I was reminded of the power of prayer as I watched the latest vlog from the Russian commentator Constantine (Inside Russia) on Youtube. He described how despite intending to stay in Russia even with the latest mobilisation going on, he had received a large number of messages encouraging him to leave, which he eventually decided to do. This was late in the surge of people leaving the country so flights were almost impossible to book. Fortunately a friend found him a seat which he was able to book, although at a cost of over \$5,000. He speaks powerfully of being aware of the many people praying for him and how he almost miraculously made it through passport control. Do take a look at his video as it is a very moving account of his journey and the awareness of Gods hand on his life and the power of prayer which enabled him to leave. It's a demonstration that our prayers are always heard and that prayer can bring about miraculous things. Sometimes we need to be reminded of that.*

## BIBLE READINGS

### Habakkuk 1.1-4; 2.1-4

1 The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw.

#### The Prophet's Complaint

2 O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen?

Or cry to you 'Violence!' and you will not save?

3 Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble?

Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise.

4 So the law becomes slack and justice never prevails.

The wicked surround the righteous—therefore judgement comes forth perverted.

### Luke 17.5-10

5 The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith!'

6 The Lord replied, 'If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you.'

7 'Who among you would say to your

slave who has just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, "Come here at once and take your place at the table"?

8 Would you not rather say to him, "Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink"?

9 Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? 10 So you also, when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, "We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!"
