REFLECTIONS FROM THE RECTORY

Today we reflect on the baptism of Jesus as another sign of his true identity during this Epiphany season. Many people are baptised as children but sadly don't have the opportunity to find out more about what God is offering them, having being adopted into his family. So are those baptisms a waste of time? Should we only baptise children from families who are believers themselves? That would certainly cut down the number we take on! Well I for one am convinced that any baptism is taken seriously by God and has an impact on that child's life - maybe only revealing that effect many years later. After all Jesus asks all who follow him to baptise and make new disciples. I'm sure that many parents feel that baptising their baby is an important milestone in life, and indeed it is, because we invite the Holy Spirit to fill and guide the child, we recognise and welcome them into the family of the church, and we mark what we hope will be the beginning of a journey of faith, that will lead them into a deeper relationship with Jesus. And even if the baptised child grows up without that relationship, their baptism has still left an indelible mark on them, even if no-one else sees it - they are still a member of Gods family, still welcome to return home.
