REFLECTIONS FROM THE RECTORY

This week has seen the coronation of King Charles and his Queen Camilla and the celebrations will continue today and tomorrow. There will be some who remember the coronation of Queen Elizabeth back in 1953, but our nation is of course very different now. There seems to be a much more muted atmosphere, with a sizeable number of people who would prefer there not to be a monarchy in at all. The much publicised tensions and fallouts in the royal family have no doubt affected how people view them, and I'm sure there will have been people waving signs that say 'Not my King' at the coronation, as there were people in America that held up similar signs after the election of Donald Trump. From a church perspective it is clear that Charles takes a different approach to his mother and is trying to be as inclusive as possible. As many of us noted at her funeral, Queen Elizabeth was an inspiration to many, motivated to a large extent by her own personal faith. I am sure King Charles will be just as committed and hard working as she was, but quite how his own faith will be reflected in his words and actions remains to be seen. Whatever our view of him may be, we need to remember him in prayer and ask for God to bless and guide him in a role that still carries enormous responsibility and expectation. We pray for our King to be filled with wisdom and the sustaining power of the Holy Spirit, that he may continue his mothers legacy, and earn the same affection and esteem from the people of our nation.

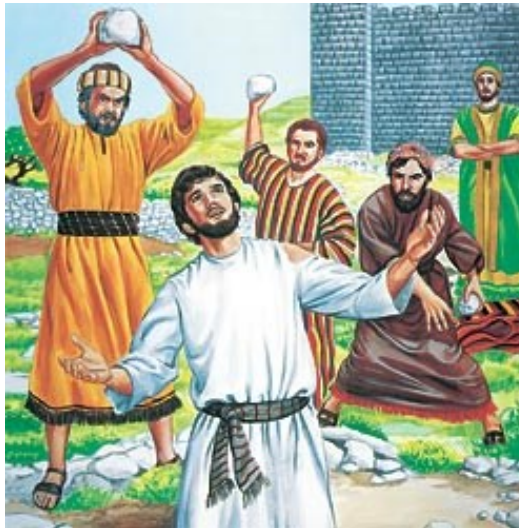

BIBLE READINGS

Acts 7.55-60

55 But filled with the Holy Spirit, he gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 56 'Look,' he said, 'I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!' 57 But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. 58 Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. 59 While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.' 60 Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them.' When he had said this, he died.



John 14.1-14

14 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. 2 In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. 4 And you know the way to the place where I am going.' 5 Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?' 6 Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. 7 If you know me, you will know my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him.' 8 Philip said to him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and we will be satisfied.' 9 Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"? 10 Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. 11 Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; but if you do not, then believe me because of the works themselves. 12 Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father. 13 I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. 14 If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.'
