BIBLE READINGS

Isaiah 6.1-8

A Vision of God in the Temple

6 In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. ²Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³And one called to another and said:

'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.'

⁴The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. ⁵And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!'

⁶Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' ⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

John 3.1-17

Nicodemus Visits Jesus

3 Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ²He came to Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' ³Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God with-

out being born from above.' ⁴Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' ⁵Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' ⁹Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' ¹⁰Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

¹¹'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

¹⁶'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

¹⁷'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

I wonder if you managed to spot the Northern lights recently? As we approach solar maximum this year, the Aurora was visible much further south than normal, and so if you ventured outside in the early hours in the second week of May and looked towards the North, you might have seen the ethereal wisps of red and green, the result of charged particles interacting with the Earth's magnetic field, and causing our atmosphere to fluoresce. The red colour is produced by nitrogen and the green from oxygen. People will sometimes go on expensive trips to the arctic circle in order to view the Aurora in all its glory, but sadly of course, nature is unpredictable and such trips can sometimes be fruitless. In April there was a total solar eclipse in America, another awe inspiring natural event, and there are regular meteor showers throughout the year which can be viewed, if the weather cooperates! All this reminds us of the wonder and majesty of God's creation, and the uniqueness of our planet. As Psalm 19 puts it, 'The Heavens declare the glory of the Lord'. Genesis tells us that God tasks humanity to look after the Earth, something we are sadly not doing a very good job of. God uses His creation to point us to Him, because, among the immensity and glory of the Universe, he is concerned that every human being should live in that sustaining relationship with him, and find their true purpose and destiny. May that encourage us as we face troubling times and an uncertain future.
