## BIBLE READINGS

**2 Samuel 5.1-5, 9-10**

**David Anointed King of All Israel**

5 Then all the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron, and said, 'Look, we are your bone and flesh. <sup>2</sup> For some time, while Saul was king over us, it was you who led out Israel and brought it in. The LORD said to you: It is you who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you who shall be ruler over Israel.' <sup>3</sup> So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron; and King David made a covenant with them at Hebron before the LORD, and they anointed David king over Israel. <sup>4</sup> David was thirty years old when he began to reign, and he reigned for forty years. <sup>5</sup> At Hebron he reigned over Judah for seven years and six months; and at Jerusalem he reigned over all Israel and Judah for thirty-three years. <sup>9</sup> David occupied the stronghold, and named it the city of David. David built the city all around from the Millo inwards. <sup>10</sup> And David became greater and greater, for the LORD, the God of hosts, was with him.

**Mark 6.1-13**

**The Rejection of Jesus at Nazareth**

6 He left that place and came to his home town, and his disciples followed him. <sup>2</sup> On the sabbath he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astounded. They said, 'Where did this man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! <sup>3</sup> Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of

James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?' And they took offence at him. <sup>4</sup> Then Jesus said to them, 'Prophets are not without honour, except in their home town, and among their own kin, and in their own house.' <sup>5</sup> And he could do no deed of power there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and cured them. <sup>6</sup> And he was amazed at their unbelief.

**The Mission of the Twelve**

Then he went about among the villages teaching. <sup>7</sup> He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. <sup>8</sup> He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; <sup>9</sup> but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. <sup>10</sup> He said to them, 'Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. <sup>11</sup> If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them.' <sup>12</sup> So they went out and proclaimed that all should repent. <sup>13</sup> They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

## REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

*As I write this reflection it is the day before the general election. All the parties are engaging in one last push before voters go the polls, and today we have even seen the return of Boris Johnson (whatever you make of that!). Although the final outcome is yet to be determined, all the pollsters are predicting a huge labour majority, with the conservative party possibly facing their worst result ever. It could be that the current two party system will finally be set aside for something more proportional, although this has been mooted before and not come to anything. It seems this year that there is little to distinguish the policies of the two main parties, both seemingly now occupying the centre ground, but there are interesting policy ideas from the smaller parties that often do not make it into the mainstream. The new government will have very difficult issues to address, and we pray for leaders who have the courage, imagination, determination and compassion to really make a difference. We need to support Christian MP's of whatever political flavour as they stand up for Kingdom values in the maelstrom that is parliament. Sadly our nation has turned away from the Christian values that once undergirded our countries priorities, and some politicians have been found lacking in personal integrity and consistency.
