## BIBLE READINGS

### 2 Samuel 7.1-14a

7 Now when the king was settled in his house, and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him,<sup>2</sup> the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent.'<sup>3</sup> Nathan said to the king, 'Go, do all that you have in mind; for the LORD is with you.'<sup>4</sup> But that same night the word of the LORD came to Nathan:<sup>5</sup> Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the LORD: Are you the one to build me a house to live in?<sup>6</sup> I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle.<sup>7</sup> Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders<sup>[a]</sup> of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, 'Why have you not built me a house of cedar?'<sup>8</sup> Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the LORD of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel;<sup>9</sup> and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you; and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth.<sup>10</sup> And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly,<sup>11</sup> from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house.<sup>12</sup> When your days are fulfilled and

you lie down with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come forth from your body, and I will establish his kingdom.<sup>13</sup> He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom for ever.<sup>14</sup> I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me. When he commits iniquity, I will punish him with a rod such as mortals use, with blows inflicted by human beings.

### Mark 6.30-34, 53-56

<sup>30</sup> The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught.<sup>31</sup> He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat.<sup>32</sup> And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves.<sup>33</sup> Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them.<sup>34</sup> As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

<sup>53</sup> When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret and moored the boat.

<sup>54</sup> When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him,<sup>55</sup> and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was.<sup>56</sup> And wherever he went, into villages or cities or farms, they laid the sick in the market-places, and begged him that they might touch even the fringe of his cloak; and all who touched it were healed.
