BIBLE READINGS

Amos 8.1-12 The Basket of Fruit

of summer fruit.² He said, 'Amos, what do you see?' And I said, 'A basket of summer fruit.' Then the LORD said to me, 'The end has come upon my people Israel; I will never again pass them by. ³The songs of the temple shall become wailings on that day,' says the Lord GoD; 'the dead bodies shall be many, cast out in every place. Be silent!' ⁴ Hear this, you that trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land, ⁵ saying, 'When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain; and the sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale? We will make the ephah small and the shekel

great, and practise deceit with false balances, ⁶ buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals, and selling the sweepings of the wheat.'

⁷The LORD has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Surely I will never forget any of their deeds. ⁸ Shall not the land tremble on this account, and everyone mourn who lives in it, and all of it rise like the Nile, and be tossed about and sink again, like the Nile of Egypt?

⁹ On that day, says the Lord God, I will make the sun go down at noon, and darken the earth in broad daylight.10 I will turn your feasts into mourning, and all your songs into lamentation; I will bring sackcloth on all loins, and baldness on every head:

I will make it like the mourning for an only son, and the end of it like a bitter day. 11 The time is surely coming, says the Lord God, when I will send

a famine on the land; not a famine of bread, or a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of 8 This is what the Lord God showed me—a basket the LORD. 12 They shall wander from sea to sea, and from north to east; they shall run to and fro, seeking the word of the LORD, but they shall not find it.

Luke 9. 10-17 **Feeding the Five Thousand**

¹⁰ On their return the apostles told Jesus all they had done. He took them with him and withdrew privately to a city called Bethsaida. 11 When the crowds found out about it, they followed him; and he welcomed them, and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed to be cured.

¹² The day was drawing to a close, and the twelve came to him and said, 'Send the crowd away, so that they may go into the surrounding villages and countryside, to lodge and get provisions; for we are here in a deserted place.' 13 But he said to them, 'You give them something to eat.' They said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish unless we are to go and buy food for all these people.' 14 For there were about five thousand men. And he said to his disciples, 'Make them sit down in groups of about fifty each.' 15 They did so and made them all sit down. ¹⁶ And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. ¹⁷ And all ate and were filled. What was left over was gathered up, twelve baskets of broken pieces.

REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

This week was the leavers service for year 6 at Harbury school, and along with that modern favourite 'My Lighthouse' we joined in the words of another old favourite: "One more step along the world I go, one more step along the world I go. It is a favourite school hymn and is often used at school leavers' services as children prepare for changing schools or moving out into the wider world.
