BIBLE READINGS

Isaiah 5.1-7

The Song of the Unfruitful Vineyard

5 Let me sing for my beloved my love-song concerning his vineyard: My beloved had a vineyard

on a very fertile hill.

REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

As many of you know, I love the summertime and this year seems to be heading towards memorable status. However sometimes the heat and lack of rain can be an issue for some, and it seems likely that harvests will be significantly lower this year. Some struggle with the temperatures we have had recently, and a lucky few even have air conditioning at home. Of course higher temperatures can make some people stressed and bad-tempered, Perhaps they become more likely to treat others less thoughtfully, or maybe become more impatient when driving or queuing. On a recent trip to Mcdonalds Julie and I saw one elderly man spending as much time as he could slumped under the air conditioning unit - I don't even think he had bought anything, but the staff seemed to recognise he needed to be out of the heat, so well done to them. Paul reminds us in Philippians to "... let each of you look not only to his own interests. but also to the interests of others." That is a tall order when under stress, but it is the right thing to do. Julie knows well that I can become a bit selfcentred when under stress, so it's a lesson I need to take to heart as much as anyone! A Christian musician Toby Mac wrote: "Be kind to unkind people, sometimes they need it the most." So when we encounter unkind people, we need to bear in mind that they might be in a stressful situation. Don't repay unkindness with unkindness. Smile and move on. We don't have to be famous to have an impact on the people around us. Be kind and let Christ shine through you; especially when the heat is on.

Prayer:

God of fire and breath, we thank you for the summer sun, but be with those who find the temperatures taxing or a challenge. We pray for farmers whose crops are struggling, for the elderly who find high temperatures hard to cope with, for those who manage water shortages and forest fires. Help us not to allow ourselves to grow indifferent to the concerns of others as we rush from one thing to another, and may we always reflect your love whatever the weather.
