Jeremiah 1.4-10 Jeremiah's Call and Commission

⁴ Now the word of the LORD came to me saying, ⁵ 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you;

Jesus Heals a Crippled Woman

¹⁰ Now he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. 11 And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. 12 When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, 'Woman, you are set free from your ailment.' 13 When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. ¹⁴ But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, 'There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day.' 15 But the Lord answered him and said, 'You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? 16 And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?' ¹⁷ When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.

REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

As I write this, negotiations are continuing in an attempt to bring an end to the horrific war in Ukraine, being driven by President Trump. While we long for the violence and destruction to end, and indeed have been praying for that since the beginning of the conflict, there are also serious concerns about what Ukraine will need to sacrifice to Putin's imperial ambitions, and how the West can prevent further invasions once Russia has rebuilt its shattered military. History sadly shows us that 'security guarantees' made in the past have been ineffective in preventing a recurrence of Russian aggression. The Christian Concept of 'Just Peace' offers a holistic approach, aiming for a comprehensive resolution that goes beyond simply the absence of conflict. It entails the active creation of conditions for lasting peace, involving justice, reconciliation, and sustainability. That will be a hugely challenging task given what we have seen of Russia's intransigence. There are echoes of the Israel/Hamas conflict here where both Israel and Ukraine are seen by their opponents as having no right to exist as sovereign nations. So we continue to pray that peace will come, and hopefully along with justice and reconciliation to enable healing and restoration to begin, but ultimately we must not place our ultimate trust in governments, military alliances, or peace treaties, but in Gods promises. True and lasting peace will only come when he establishes His Kingdom on this earth.

Prayer

Sovereign Lord, we commit the future of Ukraine into Your hands. We believe in Your power to restore and renew. May peace be established, and may justice reign. Let the people of Ukraine find a new security, trusting that a new dawn will come. May the people of Russia reject calls for renewed violence. Restore what for renewed violence. Restore what has been lost, and build a future full of hope, prosperity, and unity.
