**Micah 4:1-5**

**Peace and Security through Obedience**

4 In days to come

the mountain of the LORD's house  
shall be established as the highest of the moun-  
tains,

and shall be raised up above the hills.

Peoples shall stream to it,

<sup>2</sup> and many nations shall come and say:

'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD,  
to the house of the God of Jacob;

that he may teach us his ways

and that we may walk in his paths.'

For out of Zion shall go forth instruction,

and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem.

<sup>3</sup> He shall judge between many peoples,  
and shall arbitrate between strong nations far  
away;

they shall beat their swords into ploughshares,  
and their spears into pruning-hooks;

nation shall not lift up sword against nation,  
neither shall they learn war any more;

<sup>4</sup> but they shall all sit under their own vines and  
under their own fig trees,

and no one shall make them afraid; for the  
mouth of the LORD of hosts has spoken.

but we will walk in the name of the LORD our God  
for ever and ever.

<sup>7</sup> 'Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive  
mercy.

<sup>8</sup> 'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see  
God.

<sup>9</sup> 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be  
called children of God.

<sup>10</sup> 'Blessed are those who are persecuted for  
righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of  
heaven.

<sup>11</sup> 'Blessed are you when people revile you and  
persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against  
you falsely on my account. <sup>12</sup> Rejoice and be glad,  
for your reward is great in heaven, for in the  
same way they persecuted the prophets who  
were before you.



## REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

Once more we come to Remembrance Sunday, where we stop and reflect on the sacrifice of so many lives to protect others. The focus is always on the World Wars but of course there have been many other conflicts since. From the beginning of the war in Ukraine some of our churches have been praying every week that a way would be found to end this pointless and deadly conflict, which continues to take a dreadful toll on so many. The poppies we wear are symbols of bloodshed and lives cut tragically short. As Christians, we are called to mourn with those who mourn. We acknowledge the deep, unquantifiable grief of the millions of families and communities wounded by bereavement and lasting harm over the years. We are called to live under the banner of the cross, a powerful symbol of reconciliation and courageous love. Following Jesus calls us to actively seek justice, fight against the roots of greed and prejudice that ignite conflict, and strive to be true peacemakers. Our memory of those lost to war is not a nostalgic look backward, but a forward looking pledge to build a world where such a sacrifice will never be required again. Given the darkness too often found in the human heart this is no easy task, and it can never be complete until Gods Kingdom is fully established. But let us not succumb to despair – the light still shines in the darkness, evil cannot prosper forever, renewal, reconciliation and restoration are possible, and will come. We just continue to pray that day comes soon.

**Prayer**  
*God of all comfort, we remember in humble gratitude all those who have given their lives in war, and we pray for all who still live with the physical and mental scars of combat. We pray for places around the world where war is still a daily reality: Draw near to all who mourn lost loved ones, and strengthen all who work for peace.*
