REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

I attended an Area Deans meeting this week where we reflected on the current state of our Diocesan vision, and I was struck by how much work has gone into refining something concise but significant. In today's culture, organizations spend huge amounts of money and time drafting "Vision Statements", which are often clunky corporate attempts to try to predict where they will be in five years. But the New Testament paints a very different picture of vision. St. Paul notes that as people of God, we "walk by faith, not by sight." True spiritual vision isn't about having a perfectly formulated, crystal-clear map of the future. It's about clarity in the present as well as looking towards what is to come. It means trusting Gods guidance even when the future seems uncertain. To refresh our vision this week, we can look for three things:

- 1) Seeing God in the Ordinary: Recognizing His quiet presence in a shared meal, a moment of silence, or the beauty of a summer evening.
- 2) See Ourselves Accurately: Tuning out the voices that tell us we aren't good enough, and viewing ourselves as God sees us – unique, deeply loved, and explicitly chosen.
- 3) See Our Neighbour more clearly: Looking past the masks people often wear to notice the individual who is quietly carrying a heavy burden, living on the edge, or needing a word of encouragement.

A Prayer for the Week Ahead:

Lord of light, Creator of all that is, open the eyes of our hearts that we might see you clearly. Grant us the vision to see our community through your eyes of compassion and grace. When the path ahead looks uncertain, give us the courage to walk by faith and not by sight, trusting that your word is a lamp to our feet.

BIBLE READINGS

Acts 11 19 - 30

⁹ But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." ¹⁰ This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. ¹¹ At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. ¹² The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. ¹³ He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; ¹⁴ he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved." ¹⁵ And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. ¹⁶ And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." ¹⁷ If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God? ¹⁸ When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

The Church in Antioch

¹⁹ Now those who were scattered because of the persecution that took place over Stephen travelled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus, and Antioch, and they spoke the word to no one except Jews. ²⁰ But among them were some men of Cyprus and Cyrene who, on coming to Antioch, spoke to the Hellenists also, proclaiming the Lord Jesus. ²¹ The hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number became believers and turned to the Lord. ²² News of this came to the ears of the church in Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch.

²³ When he came and saw the grace of God, he rejoiced, and he exhorted them all to remain faithful to the Lord with steadfast devotion; ²⁴ for he was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And a great many people were brought to the Lord. ²⁵ Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, ²⁶ and when he had found him, he brought him to Antioch. So it was that for an entire year they associated with^[c] the church and taught a great many people, and it was in Antioch that the disciples were first called 'Christians'.

²⁷ At that time prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. ²⁸ One of them named Agabus stood up and predicted by the Spirit that there would be a severe famine over all the world; and this took place during the reign of Claudius. ²⁹ The disciples determined that according to their ability, each would send relief to the believers living in Judea; ³⁰ this they did, sending it to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

John 15 12-17

¹² 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. ¹⁶ You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. ¹⁷ I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.
