REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

On the 5th July back in 1948, the National Health Service was launched, founded on a radical and universal premise: that healthcare should be provided to all, free at the point of delivery, based on clinical need and not the ability to pay. As Christians, the concept of universal, compassionate care resonates deeply with the core of the Gospel. A large amount of Jesus' earthly ministry was spent healing the sick, restoring the broken, and looking after those whom society had pushed to the margins. He never checked finances or social status before extending His healing touch. The creation of the NHS was a collective, national decision to build a society that mirrors that divine compassion, ensuring that the vulnerable are looked after simply because they are human beings made in the image of God. In a way, a healthcare system free to all is a tangible, everyday picture of grace: a gift given freely to anyone who needs it, when they need it most. We all know that our healthcare system faces immense pressure and complex challenges today. Celebrating its birth isn't about looking back with misty-eyed nostalgia; it is an invitation to stand in solidarity with the people who keep it running. Our parishes are full of people who are part of this story—doctors, nurses, paramedics, porters, midwives, administrators, and cleaners. This Sunday, we offer them our gratitude and our prayers.

BIBLE READINGS

Romans 7.15-25a

¹⁵ I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶ Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. ¹⁷ But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸ For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. ²¹ So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. ²² For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, ²³ but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. ²⁴ Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? ²⁵ Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, with my mind I am a slave to the law of God, but with my flesh I am a slave to the law of sin.

Matthew 11.16-19, 25-end

¹⁶ 'But to what will I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the market-places and calling to one

another, ¹⁷ "We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we wailed, and you did not mourn."

¹⁸ For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, "He has a demon"; ¹⁹ the Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, "Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax-collectors and sinners!" Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds.'

Jesus Thanks His Father

²⁵ At that time Jesus said, 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; ²⁶ yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. ²⁷ All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

²⁸ 'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.'
