REFLECTION FROM THE RECTORY

As September begins, the familiar rhythm of the academic and working year resumes. This week, that rhythm extends to Westminster, as Parliament returns from its summer recess. Yet, this autumn brings a significant shift in our national life as Andy Burnham takes his place at the despatch box as our new Prime Minister. Whenever a new leader takes office, the atmosphere is inevitably charged with a mixture of high expectations, intense political scrutiny, and the heavy weight of national responsibility. Regardless of where our personal political allegiances lie, the Christian calling in times of political transition remains clear. In his first letter to Timothy, St. Paul urges that "petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." Paul understood that leadership is an immense burden, and that those who govern desperately require the grace and wisdom of God to seek the common good. The office of Prime Minister is a gruelling one. The decisions made in the coming weeks and months will impact the most vulnerable in our society, the shape of our local communities, and our relationships on the global stage. As Parliament reconvenes, let us commit to praying for our nation. Let us pray for Andy Burnham and his cabinet, asking that they may be guided by a spirit of wisdom, compassion, and a genuine desire for justice. Let us also pray for our local MPs as they return to Westminster, that they might serve with integrity. And ultimately, let us remember that while prime ministers and governments come and go, our ultimate hope and citizenship remain firmly rooted in the unchanging, eternal Kingdom of God.

Prayer

Lord, the ruler of all nations, we pray for our country and for those who govern us. We lift up our new Prime Minister and all members of Parliament. Grant them the wisdom to make just decisions, the courage to protect the vulnerable, and a deep commitment to the common good.

Exodus 12:1-14

The First Passover Instituted

¹ The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt:

² This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you.

³ Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household.

⁴ If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it.

⁵ Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats.

⁶ You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight.

⁷ They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it.

⁸ They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs.

⁹ Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs.

¹⁰ You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn.

¹¹ This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord.

¹² For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements:

BIBLE READINGS

I am the Lord.

¹³ The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.

¹⁴ This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

Matthew 18:15-20

Reproving Another Who Sins

¹⁵ 'If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one.

¹⁶ But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses.

¹⁷ If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax-collector.

¹⁸ Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.

¹⁹ Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven.

²⁰ For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.'
